

Biology MiTransfer Pathway

The Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) was mandated by the Michigan Legislature in Fall 2014 to replace the MACRAO agreement. The MTA allows for the transfer of 30 credits of core general education courses from a Michigan community college to a Michigan baccalaureate college or university. Students may complete the MTA as part of an associate's degree or as a standalone package. MTA courses are approved by the community college.

The Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) satisfies EMU's General Education core requirements listed below:

- Effective communication
- · Quantitative reasoning
- Knowledge of the disciplines (arts, humanities, natural sciences and social sciences)

Transfer students with an MTA endorsement on their transcript will only need to complete the general education application requirements below:

Biology

- Pathways Courses: Biology 1 and 2, General Chemistry 1 and 2,
 Organic Chemistry 1 and 2
- Physics I and II will be included as other program requirements on the new worksheet
- Math Pathways: Add College Algebra in the MTA and add all additional mathematics requirements in the remaining degree requirements



Business

- Confirmed that microeconomics, macroeconomics, financial accounting, managerial accounting, business law, and CIS are common across all institutions
- Math Pathways: All program require statistics. All programs except Wayne State also require another mathematics course (college algebra, trig, pre-calc, calculus).
- Principles of Management learning outcomes: Project staff will facilitate sharing of learning outcomes.
- CIS course: Project staff will request CIS course requirements
- 200/300 level transferability institutional and accreditation issues



Criminal Justice

- Pathways Courses Include: Intro to Psychology, Intro to Sociology, Intro to Criminal Justice, and Intro to Corrections.
- Multiculturalism/Diversity classes were not determined to be part of the pathway, but they will be treated as strategic electives.
- The CJ Pathways team is considering developing multiple tracks or a "clustered approach" to this pathway in order to accommodate the wide range of approaches to CJ instruction across the state.
- Math Pathway: Still undetermined, although Statistics and QR are dominant.



Psychology

- Pathways Courses: Intro to Psychology, Abnormal Psychology, Social Psychology, and Developmental Psychology
- Math Pathways: Statistics should be recommended as the MTA math requirement. Additional math requirements should be included in the Other Requirements section.
- 200/2000 to 300/3000-level courses should be transferable if the learning outcomes align
- Writing competency exams, psych course transferability, and extra credit are out of scope for this project

All Programs

- MiTransfer Pathways will not guarantee institutional admissions
- MiTransfer Pathways will not guarantee secondary/ program admissions
- MiTransfer Pathways "maps" provide general guidance to transfer students. Each student will follow a customized plan
- Advisors will continue to work with students to explore careers, select a program of study, and identify transfer institutions
- Undecided students will need additional support, but the maps are still the maps
- Transferring courses from 200/2000-level to 300/3000-level




